### Mountain Cattlemen Heritage Drive Gathers Strength and Support

The **Mountain Cattlemen**'s Association announced today that the small symbolic mobs of cattle that are slowly being driven across the Alpine Park by **Mountain Cattlemen**, in a protest against the taking of **grazing** licences, are to meet up in the next few days deep in the Alpine National Park.

"The cattle and drovers are to all meet up at the historic Wonnangatta Cattle Station" president of the **MCAV** Doug Treasure said this morning.

Mr Treasure explained Wonnangatta Station was the most remote freehold cattle station in Victoria until it was resumed by the Cain Government in 1988, **grazing** stopped, and later put into the **Alpine** National Park.

"The Station is steeped in pioneering history. It is a naturally open valley surrounded by high mountains and is an intensely beautiful place". He said

Mr Treasure said before it was taken by the Cain Government, the freehold Wonnangatta Station was well managed by its former owners and is at the physical crossroads of several historic stock routes.

"The stock route from Dargo to Myrtleford, Mansfield to Wonnangatta and Heyfield to Wonnangatta all meet at the Station." He explained

"It is therefore appropriate that these historic cattle drives meet at Wonnangatta using those original stock routes and a traditional Bushman's handshake on the horses as the mobs join together at the old station site will obviously occur.

"After the cattle meet up on Tuesday the **MCAV** and the lobby group Country Voice have organized a meeting of all the drovers and supporters about 2pm. I have been asked to speak, as have several other significant people.

"I will be giving the protest full support," Mr. Treasure announced.

"Other speakers will include Mr Wally Mortimer who has written several books on the history of Wonnangatta station and the puzzling murders which have now passed into folk law

"The cattle and drovers will then leave Wonnangatta and travel over the Great Divide to the **Mountain Cattlemen's Association of Victoria**'s Get-Together, which will be held at Rose River next weekend, he said.
