One of Australia's most ambitious group herd improvement schemes has begun in North East Victoria.

Members of the Victorian Commercial Hereford Breeders Group have installed 50 of their most promising young bulls in a post weaning weight gain test.

The Victorian Depart-ment of Agriculture will give technical assistance and help with the collection and interpretation of data.

The experiment is only part of a long term search for breeding improvement

by the group.

Site for the test is Wappan Park, the 8000 acre property of J. Tehan and Sons at Bonnie Doon (Vic.), on the banks of

Lake Eildon. 
