- &&Gippsland Branch is not in favour of the L.C.C. proposed recommendations to exclude grazing from any public lands already grazed where this grazing is not detrimental to the environment.
- Active ask the L.C.C. to reconsider the M.D.C.V. submission particularily the map on grazing areas because the proposals are unmanagable and impractical.
- & Strongly Oppose the areas defined in B1 and A25.
- & we spose the L.C.C. report on moss beds, we feel that the L.C.C. has not looked at this subject objectively.
- & are opposed to the wilderness areas as set out in area A1 of
 - LCC report because: 1. It does not meet with the concept of wilderness as set out in the recommendations.
 - 2. Would exclude 300 head of cattle from the area.
 - 3. There is no evidence that cattle have damaged this area.
- &The Agricultural Department be given representation on the management Committee of the Alpine Area.
- & are Concerned about the lack of land set aside for future agricultural development.
- &&It was suggested that the delegates to Central Council move that M.D.C.A.V. BE ON THE Management committee of the Alpine Area.
