#### BENDIGO EASTER FAIR 1986 - by ALAN DRASH.

Once again Bendigo saw a line-up of Mountain Cattlemen at their Easter Show. Three days of activities over the Easter weekend. The Cattlemens first appearance was on the Easter Saturday in the Horse and Harness Parade. The Cattlemen were greeted with great applause as they rode in the Parade.

On Easter Sunday the Cattlemen showed their great sportsmanship by taking part in the whip-cracking. This event was judged by well-known rodeo and whip-cracking champion Brian Gill. The whip-cracking event was won by Mountain Cattleman Max Blair of the North East Branch who also won the whip-cracking at the Cattlemens Get Together at Catherine Station. Max's daughter Pamela won the junior whip-cracking.

A large crowd lined the rails for the pack-horse race. A great deal of interest was shown in this race, as most of the spectators had never seen a horse packed before. The Bendigo Easter Fair Committee has had a lot of letters since, praising both the whip-cracking and the pack horse race, and asking that they be part of next years events! The pack horse race was won by Nug Wyllie, with a close second being Mountain Cattleman Frank Ryan of Cheshunt.

Easter Monday was the day for the Gala Street Procession, before an estimated crowd of 70,000. The Cattlemen were given a great ovation by the crowds of spectators lined up along the entire three miles of the route through the Bendigo streets. Even without a banner, but with Cattlemen stickers on saddle bags, the Cattlemen were cheered and encouraged.
